Periyar Lake Reserve No. 39

It is hereby notified under section 18 of Regulation of 1068 that from and after this date the tract specified in the subjoined schedule shall be deemed to be a reserved forest.

Name of Reserve - Periyar Reserve 39

Taluk - Thodupuzha
Extent - 160 sq. miles

East : The British Travancore boundaries

North: The line of the Channel miles from the tunnel at Kumili down to its junction with the Lake above the Periyar Project Dam.

West : The water shed of the stream running into the Periyar above the Project Dam which may be roughly defined as a line running due south from the dam for a distance of 10 miles.

South: The water shed of the Periyar River above the Dam which may be roughly described as a line running due east from the southern end of the western boundary till it strikes the British Travancore Boundary. The distance will be about 10 miles.

COMMUNICATION

The following traces now exist within the reserve.

1. 6 feet trace from Thamicutty to Shivagiri British boundary 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ miles.
2. 6 feet trace from Yezhanakuzhi to Udumatt $\frac{3}{4}$ miles.
3. 6 feet trace from 3rd Metto to Lekshnipara 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ miles.
4. 6 feet trace from turn of Shivagiri road to Narayakuzhi $\frac{5}{8}$ miles.
5. 6 feet trace from turn of Mlapara to Inchipara 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ miles.

6. 6 feet trace from Chamapara to Methaganam mettu 2 miles.
7. 6 feet trace from Thannikuddy boundary to Ummikuppam $1 \frac{7}{8}$ miles.
8. 6 feet trace from boat landing to Kozhikanam Estate 3 miles.
9. 6 feet trace from Southern extremity of the lake to Upper to Pambayar 8 miles.

Of the above 1 to 8m are now being maintained by the P.W.D. 9th is a trace open by the British Government in connection with the taking of observation of level in the Pambayar river of the total distance of 8 miles to Pambayar about 3 miles fall within the Periyar Reserve. A road is now suggested to connect Kumili to Thannikuddy the want of which is now felt very much.

PERIYAR WILDLIFE SANCTUARY PROPER

F1-2854/49/DD

11th August 1950

It is hereby notified that the area known as 'Periyar Lake Reserve Forest' falling within boundaries specified below is declared a Game Sanctuary and that this Sanctuary called hereinafter 'the Wildlife Sanctuary Proper' is permanently closed under Sections 21 and 22 of the Travancore Forest Act II of 1068 as continued in force by the USTC Administration and application of Laws Act, 1125 (VI of 1125) against all shooting, hunting, felling and cutting down of timber, collection of forest produce, grazing of cattle and all trespass except under and with the specific orders of Government.

Name: The Wildlife Sanctuary Proper (Periyar Lake Reserve Forest) (232 sq.miles)
Revenue Division: Kottayam and Quilon
Taluks: Peerumedu and Pathanamthitta

BOUNDARIES

North: Starting from a point on the K.K.Road at the eastern limit of S.No.17/2 of Periyar Pakuthy near the 68th Mile stone the boundary runs nearly eastwards along the K.K.Road till it meets the North Western corner of S.No.19/3 of Periyar Pakuthy, thence along the western boundary on S.Nos. 19/3 and 19/1 of Periyar Pakuthy to the southern most corner of the latter S.No. thence north east along the eastern limit of S.No.19/1 to the water spread line of the Periyar lake, thence along the line of the tunnel till it meets the boundary of Madura District thence along the boundary of the same District upto Pakkadimettu via. Mangaladevi Medaganam (locally known as Medhakanam) and Surulipara

East: From Pakkadimettu the boundary runs along the boundaries of Madura, Ramnad and Tirunelvely Districts upto Kallimalai, via Vellimalai, Kottamalai, Pachairmalai, Tholaimalai-mettu, Pulamalai and Sivagiri Malai.

South: From Kallimalai the boundary follows the watershed line between Periyar and Pambayar Rivers upto Uppuparai via Chokkampattimalai, Udamalai, Manikkamalai, Sundaramalai, Nagamalai, Pachimalai, Manalkkavala and Karuvattuparamalai.

West: From Uppupara the boundary runs nearly N.E along the eastern limit of S.No.15 of Malapara Pakuthy upto Periyar Dam via Anacheruthamalai, thence first northwest and thence northeast along the survey watershed line of the streams running into Periyar lake upto the starting point via., Kariallamalai.
